My family has received several scarves and hats from "Halmunee" for the east coast winters. Being an active member at the center gives my mother purpose and joy in her "golden" years.

I am thankful for the forethought and vision of our founders who created AWCA 40 years ago. Their outlook has paved the way for women's leadership! AWCA's mission to serve the community centered on Christ's love is paramount to enriching and assisting our neighbors to become healthy and contributing members of society. Even though we had to close our operation and daily activities because of the unprecedented COVID-19 global pandemic, AWCA's mission did not waiver and did not change. We continued to serve those in desperate need. We are still taking calls to assist via telephone and have created Angel food baskets and have distributed them throughout Bergen County. For the reasons mentioned above, I am proud to serve alongside the incredible women at AWCA. As we celebrate the accomplishments of the last 40 years, it is my hope and prayer our vision remains constant and women's leadership will thrive into the next 40 years.

COVID-19 Global Pandemic 'Overcoming Together'

The state government of New Jersey issued an official COVID-19 emergency order for all businesses to close temporarily. The center of AWCA, located in Teaneck, Bergen County, closed its building temporarily from Tuesday, March 17, 2020, and all AWCA employees began working from home in accordance with the state order. While working from home, AWCA members started a COVID-19 Helpline, operating from 9am to Midnight, Monday to Friday. Through social networking platforms such as the Korean app (Kakao), Chinese app (WeChat) and Japanese app (Lime), we have been providing coronavirus related updates as well as social welfare counseling services in each respective language. Three months after the state order was lifted, AWCA was able to reopen on June 22, 2020 and employees returned to work. As of July, our efforts to overcome the COVID-19 global pandemic together have been ongoing. From the end of March to the end of July, AWCA prepared over 500 "Angel Food Baskets" which included health and safety items such as food, handmade masks, and hand sanitizers. AWCA directly delivered 500 Angel Baskets to people living in Bergen County and some New York and Central New Jersey areas. Our outreach efforts were sponsored by more than 70 individuals and churches as well as the Korean American Community Foundation (KACF) and the Overseas Koreans Foundation. We would like to sincerely thank the AWCA staff members, volunteers, and Board of Directors for all of their efforts and hard work delivering the Angel Baskets and providing help during this dangerous time.



2020 Census 'Preparation for the Future'

The year of 2020 is the year of the Census, which runs once every 10 years. Since AWCA was designated as the 2020 Census Public Outreach Center by the government of New Jersey, we began training staff and volunteers through a Census Workshop Program in the summer of 2019. We also provided training to members participating in all of AWCA's programs. In addition, AWCA held multiple recruiting and training sessions for census takers. We took active initiative by opening census kiosks in three languages (Korean, Japanese, and Chinese) in the AWCA center. Even after the peak of COVID-19 in New Jersey, AWCA encouraged census participation online, by phone, in person as we delivered Angel Food Baskets to homes and opened mobile census kiosks in the towns of Ridgefield, Palisades Park, Cliffside Park, etc. Census takers are visiting households that have not yet participated. Anyone living in the United States should participate to be counted. Census results are applied until 2030 and help determine how billions of dollars in federal funding flow into states and communities each year. Getting a complete and accurate account requires everyone's help. Investing just 10 minutes to participate in the census will shape the future of the next 10 years.

2020 SAT & ACT Scholarship Class Opening - Online Intensive Course

In an effort to respond to COVID-19, AWCA offered a full scholarship program to a total of 15 students in grades 10, 11, and 12 from financially disadvantaged families in New York, New Jersey, and Illinois. The Prestige Institute provided lessons with their teaching staff and materials. Shelby Kim and Ellie Chung served as volunteer Teaching Assistants for AWCA, and the Grace Charity Foundation funded the program.

AWCA Office Reopening

AWCA reopened its Teaneck office on June 22 after three months of closing its doors since March 16, according to the New Jersey State Governor's Gradual Reopen Procedures Order. During the time AWCA was closed due to COVID-19, the Social Services Program provided online-only help with news updates and social welfare questions through social networking services such as Korean (Kakao), Chinese (WeChat) and Japanese (Lime). AWCA continues to offer its Social Services in-person and other programs through online service.



AWCA Receives KACF Grant Award

AWCA became the recipient of the Korean American Community Foundation (KACF) Grant Award for its Social Services Program in 2020. KACF granted a total amount of \$67,000 for a one-year period to the Social Services Team at AWCA. Within the New York and New Jersey areas, KACF awarded 10 non-profit organizations.



AWCA Kickoff Ceremony for 2020 Census

AWCA was designated as the official 2020 Census Promoting Agency and received funds from the State of New Jersey. On February 17, AWCA launched a kickoff ceremony and mobilized a task team for the 2020 Census. In attendance at the ceremony were 40 guests, including Korean, Chinese, and Japanese translation volunteers, Bergen County Freeholder Ms. Germaine Ortiz, and the President of Korean American Census Task Force, Mr. Andrew Kim. AWCA's task force team is in charge of announcing the importance of the complete counts of the 2020 Census.



Inauguration of Newly Appointed Board Chair, Julie Dines



AWCA Board of Directors held its general meeting and elected Ms. Julie Dines as the new Chair of the Board. She became the 17th Chair of AWCA Board of Directors. Board Chair Dines' appointment will be a two-year term period from January 2020 to December 2021.

The Only Asian-American Promotion Organization of 2020 Census in New Jersey State

AWCA was selected to promote the 2020 Census and received grants from the New Jersey State's Census 2020 Committee as the only non-profit organization. Among the total of 52 grantee organizations, AWCA is the only Asian-American non-profit organization.



Volunteer Appreciation Day

On December 9, 2019, AWCA Board of Directors held a dinner event on Volunteer Appreciation Day for its volunteers to express gratitude. The Board and staff members prepared dinner as well as awards for the volunteers for their services in the year of 2019. Over 60 volunteers and staff participated and shared a memorable time with the Board members.



AWCA and CarePlus Collaboration - Mental Healthcare Seminar

On November 17, 2019, AWCA & CarePlus collaborated on a Mental Healthcare Seminar for teens, regarding mental healthcare and Puberty Psychology in suicide prevention with a Q&A session. CarePlus mental healthcare supervisor and the Director of the KAOS Program, Mr. Kevin Woo, prepared and



delivered the seminar. A total of 15 high school students participated and actively engaged in the seminar.

Dementia Prevention Seminar, New Jersey Retired Pastor's Association

On November 7, 2019, AWCA's Senior Program offered a Dementia Prevention Seminar at the New Jersey Retired Pastor's Association Worship Service and provided individual dementia self-testing materials. The attendees received the self-test results with private consultation.



AWCA 39th Anniversary Annual Gala

On November 1, 2019, AWCA held its 39th Anniversary Annual Gala Dinner Event at the Pearl River Hilton Hotel in New York. Over 300 Asian Americans and other communities were in attendance, providing encouragement by pledging to continue working for the community and support AWCA's dedication to social service works. Merit Awards were presented to Mr. Steve Kang, Mr. Dongin Cho, and Ms. Yilan Hsu in recognition for their outstanding volunteer services. The gala successfully ended with a closing statement speech from Ms. Susan Kwan, the Chair of AWCA Board of Directors, who addressed appreciation and continued services in love in action.



American Red Cross CPR/AED/First Aid Certificate Training Program

AWCA was appointed as the American Red Cross Training Center at the beginning of 2019 and offered a total of four certificates of training to its senior and youth members. A total of 32 participants completed the training successfully and received the American Red Cross Adult and Infant CPR/AED/First Aid Certificates.



Youth Leadership Program



AWCA offered the Youth Leadership Program to teens for the duration of 2019. AWCA Educational Director, Ms. Stephanie Jang, led the program, which covered volunteerism, community leadership, political participation, American Red Cross CPR/AED/First Aid Certificate Training, Social Etiquette and Table Manners, and Successful Leadership Skills. A total

of eight participants completed and received AWCA Leadership Certificates.

Chinese-American Dementia Prevention Seminar

On Saturday, September 21, 2019, AWCA held a Dementia Prevention Seminar for Chinese-American seniors at the Englewood Health Auditorium. The seminar, "Beyond the Fear of Dementia," focused on explaining dementia and dementia prevention. The program introduced fun brain quizzes and exercises. Staff provided dementia self-tests to participants with prior appointments. Test-takers received the results of the self-test scores in individual private conversations.



2019 Kihwa Scholarship Awards

On August 26, AWCA selected two applicants, Ms. Esder Chung of Rutgers University and Ms. Yuri Suh of Syracuse University, for the AWCA 2019 Kihwa Scholarship Award in the amount of \$3,000 to each recipient. Every year, AWCA selects two final recipients for the Kihwa Scholarship Award. Ms. Kihwa Kwak, a registered nurse retiree with 40 years of service, established the scholarship award to encourage and support notable students from financially disadvantaged families.



2019 SAT & ACT Summer Scholarship Program

AWCA offered a SAT & ACT Summer Scholarship Program for six weeks from July 6 to August 15, 2019. AWCA Educational Director, Ms. Stephanie Jang, managed and directed the program, which included a total of 22 students from financially disadvantaged families. AWCA received the scholarship fund from the Grace Charity Foundation.



AWCA and CarePlus Sign MOU for Mental Health Programs

On August 16, 2019, AWCA and CarePlus officially agreed on



MOU for Mental Health Programs. CarePlus has long served as the professional mental healthcare organization for our community. For the last thirty years, AWCA directly offered Mental Health Counseling. Under MOU agreement, AWCA will solely concentrate on mental health prevention programs, while CarePlus KAOS Services will oversee all other matters from counseling to hospitalization. For the last 41 years, CarePlus had offered the full range of professional services in Mental Health as the government-appointed mental healthcare center.

Social Welfare Service Seminar

On July 15, 2019, AWCA held a Social Service Seminar at the AWCA Auditorium. The Social Service Training Program Instructor, Mr. Frank Lee, explained about Medicare, Medicaid, Senior Housing, Programs and provided individual counseling sessions to the 65 participating attendees.



The 10th Grace Hotline Volunteer Certification Ceremony

On June 20, 2019, AWCA held the 10th Grace Hotline Volunteer Certifications Ceremony at the Auditorium. All trainees who participated successfully completed the five weeks training program from May 21, 2019. From July 2019, between the hours of 9am to midnight, the newly certified volunteers joined the existing volunteers, taking calls in turns for AWCA Grace Hotline (877-862-1116).



AWCA and Holy Name Hospital - Colon Cancer Seminar

On June 5, 2019, AWCA and Holy Name Hospital offered a 2019 Colon Cancer Seminar & Free Screening Kit to 60 event



attendees. The Seminar mainly covered the importance of early detection of cancer and the newest medical treatment technologies.

"Backstage with Her Stories" Event Success

On June 1, 2019, AWCA held the "Backstage with Her Stories" event at the Englewood Health Auditorium, which was a great success with over 300 attendees. Dr. Hwain Lee, AWCA Founder, Ms. Kyung B. Yoon, President of the Korean American Community Foundation, and Ms. Youngsoo Choi, Volunteer of Englewood Health, shared their community volunteer experiences on stage. The event featured a classical music ensemble program, directed by Ms. Nayoung Baek and nine other musicians.



Spring Senior Bazaar

On May 22, 2019, AWCA coordinated a 2019 Senior Bazaar at the Auditorium to raise funds for AWCA Senior Program. The preparation of various Korean foods as well as scarves, accessories, and kitchen wares drew in many customers. AWCA board members, especially, boosted sales with in-house made Happy Dumplings and raised a total of \$9,000 in funds that night.



Mother's Day Celebration with Asian Senior Center

On May 8, 2019, AWCA hosted a 2019 Mother's Day Celebration Ceremony at the Auditorium. In attendance were Korean, Japanese, and Chinese senior members. Over 100 members gathered and enjoyed lunch and rice cakes provided by AWCA Board of Directors. Board members also prepared Mother's Day Carnation corsages and personally pinned them to each member to express their love and care.



At-Home Childcare Training Certification Program

AWCA offered the At-Home Childcare Training Program, an eight week program from March to April, to its members to equip them with the skills needed for childcare. A total of eight trainees who successfully completed the program were awarded lifetime certifications. The program was directed by Ms. Stephanie Jang, AWCA Educational Program Director, and course materials were provided from the Certification Department of America.



Fundraising Spring Fashion Show

On April 9, 2019, AWCA held its 2019 Spring Fashion Show with over 65 attendees at the Oceanaire Seafood Room in The Shops at Riverside. AWCA and the Simon Malls collaborated for this event and raised \$7,000 in funds for AWCA Social Service Programs.



Grace Hotline Child Abuse Certification

AWCA offered educational training on Child Abuse to Grace Hotline Volunteers in March 2019. A total of twelve volunteers participated and completed the necessary training to receive the certification. AWCA Grace Hotline certified volunteers provide services on Child Abuse matters.



2019 'Brain Olympics'- Dementia Prevention Event at Englewood Health

On Saturday, April 13, 2019, AWCA and Englewood Health co-hosted the Dementia Prevention Event at Englewood Health Auditorium. The program featured Psychiatric Consultant, Dr. Ho Young Lee, Neurology Specialist, Dr. Yun-Beom Choi, Math Therapist, Dr. Chris Lee, and Recreation Therapist, Ms. Dana Kim. The event's theme was the importance of dementia prevention and raising awareness about dementia prevention. Over 300 participants were in attendance and enjoyed nutrition-balanced lunches that are good for the brain as well as mental exercises and games that help stimulate the brain.



Joy Chorus at the Korean Independence Movement Day Ceremony

March 1 marks the Samiljeol Korean Independence Movement Day. On March 1, 2019, AWCA hosted a ceremony in



celebration of the historical day with AWCA's Joy Chorus and members of The Korean American Community. Joy Chorus performed special patriotic songs to commemorate the Korean Independence Movement and historical patriots. AWCA's Joy Chorus includes 25 of AWCA Senior Center members.

AWCA 38th Anniversary Annual Gala

On November 2, 2018, AWCA held its 38th Anniversary Annual Gala at Pearl River Hilton Hotel in upstate New York. The keynote address was given by Dr. William K. Lee, Board Emeritus of YMCA Greater New York, who presented Merit Awards to Ms. Melissa Koronakis, the Marketing Director of the Riverside Mall, New Jersey Chodae Community Church Organizational Outreach Department, and Ms. Moon Soo Kim, AWCA's Japanese program volunteer. HOME CARE NEWS

News for the Second Half of 2019

1. September 2019

For the third In-Service Training, "Self-Study Homework Materials" were delivered to all members of Home Health Aid participants. The materials included topics on Pain Management, Fall Precaution, Safety Precaution, and Back Precaution in Korean and Chinese versions. They are valuable materials for preventing unexpected accidents while caregivers treat patients.

2. October 2019 - The 57th CHHA Training Class

From October 7 to 18, a two-week training program continued for the 57th CHHA Training. The seventeen participants took a 76-hour training program that was approved by the New Jersey state government, and they received their official certificates.

3. November 2019

The 4th In-Service Training Class was held for four days. Through Q and A sessions, the participants were given a chance to learn more medical information about the cold virus and various diseases of the respiratory system. They also were given information about updates in administrative changes in the New Jersey Home system.

News for the First Half of 2020

1. Due to COVID-19, the 58th Home Care Aid Training session in April was canceled. Even though many prospective participants inquired about the session, the training was canceled in compliance with the particular administrative order of the state government of New Jersey.

2. In-service training was modified into Self-Study.

3. For better patient care, PPE materials were provided to all the Home Care participants.


