
It has already been ten years since the AWCA first moved to Teaneck to rent a one-story building in which to run our programs. The building was old and the space was not big enough to accommodate our growing programs, and so the landlord proposed expanding the building to a second floor and construction began immediately. This past June, we moved back into our newly expanded building which was finally completed after a whole year of construction.

The day we moved back into our new two-story building, the AWCA family prayed a silent prayer in our hearts: that God would allow many beautiful things to happen here, and that He would allow the AWCA to become like family to those who are suffering and in need.

Although all of our programs and departments were operating from various different locations during the one year that the building was under construction, the separation made us think of each other more often, and all of our volunteers and program members waited anxiously for the day we would return home. SAT Scholarship Class

The AWCA SAT Scholarship Class of 2015 came to a close on August 7. Of the nineteen students who were selected for entrance into this class, 15 students successfully completed the intensive 5-week course, accomplishing an increase in their scores of up to 300 points. The SAT Scholarship Class is an SAT prep course offered free of charge to 10th through 12th grade students of low-income families, and this year the program was sponsored by Grace Charity Foundation. The students not only prepared for their exams, but also had times of self-reflections through sermons, panel discussions with their seniors, and career talks with successful business people. This year's SAT Scholarship Class was operated under the supervision of program director Rachel Kang. Instructors Jackson Kim and Nicholas Moon taught the class for the second time this year, and Christina Kang and Kendall Kim volunteered their time as teaching assistants.





Expansion of Social Services - Partnership with Bergen County

On July 29, three staff members of AWCA successfully completed social service training at the Bergen County Division of Senior Services, graduating the program with members of two other volunteer organizations on this day. Tae Joon Cha, Daniel Chung, and Rachel Kang, who

KACF Grant -Awarded to the AWCA Senior Program

The AWCA Senior Program received a grant in the amount of \$25,000 from the Korean-American Community Foundation (KACF) for the second year in a row. This grant will be used to support the operations of the AWCA Senior Program for the next year. A grant distribution ceremony was held on July 22, 2015, at the Barn Joo Restaurant in Manhattan, during which the KACF distributed 21 grants totaling \$575,000 to Korean and other organizations.



AWCA Senior Program - Recognized as an Official Bergen County Senior Center

The AWCA Senior Program has been recognized as an official Bergen County Senior Center, and beginning this September, the program's operating hours will be expanded to a full five days per week. The Korean Senior Center will be open on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays; the Japanese Senior Center on Thursdays; and the Chinese Senior Center will be open on Fridays. The Senior Center is



open from 9am to 1pm daily.







Commemorating the Publication of 'Korean Schools in the New York-New Jersey Area'

On July 7, 2015, a special event was held at the Korean Consulate General in New York to commemorate the publication of 'Korean Schools in the New York-New Jersey Area,' a book documenting the history and current state of Korean schools in the New York area. This book includes complete information on Korean schools in the New York Korean immigrant community, and includes the AWCA Angel School in the section discussing Korean schools that have been established with a special purpose. Compiled by Kwangho Lee, Byung-gap Min, Jong-kwon Park, and Jiyoung Oh, this publication received a \$10,000 grant from the Overseas Koreans Foundation and has gone

through a rigorous preparation process for one year.

Letter from a Client

* This letter is written by a member of the support group for parents of children in Individualized Education Program (IEP) at school.

Although it hasn't been that long since I joined the support group at the Family Counseling Center (FCC) of AWCA, I'd like to write a few words about my experience.

I am the mother of a teenage boy diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Growing up, my son had a difficult time making friends his age, and had much difficulty adjusting to school life. As hard as it was for my son, it was also difficult for me and my husband and the rest of our family. I felt such remorse for not being able to understand my son, but also such anger towards him for blaming us as his parents for all of his problems and difficulties. Each passing day was filled with such uncontrollable emotions and pain. You cannot imagine how much comfort and consolation I received from the monthly support group in the midst of all my sorrow.

The hurtful words about my son whispered behind my back by the other parents just for laughs would leave scars on my heart. My son kept the curtains of his room closed tight even in the daytime, and I shut myself off from the world along with him. It was a time when even the words of solace spoken to me by my worrying family would cause me pain. The FCC support group only met once a month, but going there allowed me to vent and share all the things that I had been keeping inside, giving me strength to return to my life and persevere. I am so thankful to the other members of the group for listening to the stories that I could not share with anyone anywhere else, empathizing with my pain as if it were their own, and encouraging me, and to the counselor at the FCC for facilitating and leading our times together.



Home Care

The AWCA Home Care is the first Asian-American organization to obtain the Health Care Service Firm license, and currently provides home care services to Korean and Chinese senior citizens. With the motto, "Caring for patients like family," the AWCA Home Care Agency is recognized by the community as a successful home care provider thanks to the sacrifice and hard work of the agency's nurses, staff members, and home health aides.

Competency Evaluation

All staff members who are working as Certified Home Health Aides (CHHA) must complete Competency Evaluations once every year to assess their competency in caring for the patients and fulfilling their duties. All members must complete a practicum which includes tasks such as measuring pulse, temperature, and respiration rates. Members must also demonstrate their competency





in bathing bedridden patients and providing sponge baths on a mannequin.

Furthermore, members learn through pictures and video the precautions one must take with a patient who is unable to walk, and directly experience what it is like to move with a wheelchair or cane. Evaluations are conducted with each member to determine their ability to communicate with the patient, record the patient's observed condition, carry out the patient's plan of care, and report the patient's condition to the agency.

The members also retrained in the specifics of responding to an emergency situation, nutrition required by a diabetic patient, caring for a patient's feet and skin, rehabilitation and recovery of a stroke patient, caring for a seizure patient, and more.

This training takes approximately one hour to complete, and is carried out under the supervision of a registered nurse. The AWCA Home Care Agency holds this training once every year in August in order to evaluate all of the skills necessary to work as a home health aide.
